(April 8, 2019, Tucson Arizona); Invisible Theatre concludes its 48th Anniversary Season with the Southwest Premiere of 20TH CENTURY BLUES by Susan Miller. This sharply funny and evocative new play features an all-star cast: Molly McKasson, Susan Baker, ToReeNee Wolf, Geri Hooper Wharham, P.J. Peavy, and Cole Potwardowski and is directed by Susan Claassen with Fred Rodriguez. A reunion. An Argument. A Ted Talk. Emotional mutiny. And a bond that connects four women who meet once a year for a photo shoot, chronicling their changing (and aging) selves as they navigate through love, careers, children, and major world events. But, when these private photographs have the potential to go public in a retrospective at MoMA, their relationships are tested, forcing the women to confront who they are, what they've become, and how they'll deal with whatever lies ahead.

The Invisible Theatre (IT) of Tucson, a 501(c)(3) organization, is dedicated to producing quality theatre and arts education experiences for all facets of the community in an intimate setting that showcases local professional talent and guest artists. IT takes its name from the invisible energy that flows between a performer and audience, creating the magic of theatre. Started in 1971 as an arena for local playwrights, the theatre has expanded its programs to include adaptations of classics and recent Off-Broadway plays and musicals, while continuing to encourage new playwrights through both full productions and staged readings.

Under the leadership of Managing Artistic Director Susan Claassen, Associate Artistic Director James Blair, and PR Director Cathy Johnson, IT is strongly committed to community service and outreach programs. The company's current season includes a six play Main Stage season, many special events, a world class cabaret series, organizational collaborations, educational tours, seminars that encourage community dialogue and Project Pastime – an educational theatre program for mentally challenged youth.

The Invisible Theatre, the recipient of the first Arizona Theatre Association Award for Best Producing Theatre Company, is a member of the Theatre Communications Group and has long enjoyed both local and national recognition for its strong leadership role in the arts community. Productions take place in an intimate 80-seat converted laundry building. IT celebrates its 48th season with an even greater commitment to professionalism, artistic excellence, accessibility, freedom of expression, diverse programming and creative challenge – thus making the Invisible Theatre a very visible force in Tucson's cultural community.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

SUSAN MILLER (playwright) is a two-time OBIE Award winner and Guggenheim Playwriting Fellow, known for her critically acclaimed one-person show, MY LEFT BREAST, which premiered in Louisville's Humana Festival and has been performed across the U.S., Canada, and France. She also received the coveted Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, as well as the Pinter Prize for her play, A MAP OF DOUBT AND RESCUE. Her play, AVERAGE AMERICAN, won Second Prize in the Arch & Bruce Brown Foundation's Play Contest. Miller's work has been recognized with a Rockefeller Grant and two NEAs. She has been a Core Writer at the Playwrights' Center in Minneapolis and her plays which include NASTY RUMORS AND FINAL REMARKS, FLUX, CONFESSIONS OF A FEMALE DISORDER, CROSS COUNTRY, THE GRAND DESIGN (Finalist, Heideman Award), ARTS AND LEISURE, FOR DEAR LIFE, IT'S OUR TOWN, TOO, and READING LIST have been done at the Joseph Papp Public Theatre, Second Stage, Naked Angels, New York Stage & Film, the Mark Taper Forum, Theatre J. Trinity Rep, Walnut Street Theatre, City Theatre of Miami, the O'Neill National Playwrights Conference, Ojai Playwrights Conference, and Contemporary American Theater Festival, among others, Miller was a consulting producer/writer on Showtime's "The L Word" and ABC's "Thirtysomething". She won the Writers Guild of America Award for her hit indie web series, "Anyone But Me", which has earned over 50 million views worldwide and can be streamed on Hulu. Miller also served for seven years as co-director of the renowned Dramatists Guild Fellows program. Her articles have appeared in "American Theatre", "O, The Oprah Magazine", "The Bark", "MS magazine", and "The Dramatist". Susan Miller lives and writes in New York City.
