September 1 - 12, 2020

Another opportunity to see this emotional, lyrical, and funny play that tells the story of Max and his classmate Lily, who are making a film about legendary artists Georgia O'Keeffe and Alfred Stieglitz. When Max's estranged grandfather unexpectedly shows up the family's hidden and mysterious past is revealed.

TRUMBO: Red, White and Blacklisted by Christopher Trumbo

October 20 - November 8, 2020

When legendary screenwriter Dalton Trumbo stood up in the House of Un-American Activities Committee in 1947, he was thrown in prison and blacklisted as one of the "Hollywood Ten". Based on his brilliant and razor-sharp letters to friends, former friends, and family, Trumbo reveals how the author of "Spartacus", "Roman Holiday", and "Exodus" took on Congress, Hollywood, and the Red Scare – and won. TRUMBO combines wit, bravery and true patriotism. Dalton Trumbo served time in prison for "contempt of Congress". He agreed: "As far as I was concerned, it was a completely just verdict. I had contempt for that Congress and have had contempt for several since."
